

What are the different types of data channels used in 5G?

There are three main types of data channels that are used within mobile communications systems. This is true for 5G systems, and accordingly the hierarchy is given below. Traffic channels: The traffic logical channels are used for the transfer of user plane data.

What frequencies are used in 5G?

5G networks operate on a variety of frequency bands, which are divided into two main categories: Sub-6 GHz Bands: These include frequencies below 6 GHz, such as 600 MHz, 2.5 GHz, 3.5 GHz, and 4.9 GHz. These bands are similar to those used in 4G LTE but offer better coverage and penetration.

How a 5G communication system works?

By organising the data into various channelsthe 5G communications system is able to manage the data transfers in an orderly fashion and the system is able to understand what data is arriving and hence it is able to process it in the required fashion.

What is a 5G wireless communication channel?

The 5G wireless communication channel model uses millimeter-wave(mm-Wave) technology, which works in the higher frequency range of 24.25-52.6 GHz. This method enables a broader spectrum of frequencies, resulting in a larger bandwidth and facilitating better data transmission rates.

What are 5G physical channels?

The 5G physical channels are used to transport information over the actual radio interface. They have the transport channels mapped into them as seen in the diagrams, but they also include various physical layer data required for the maintenance and optimisation of the radio communications link between the UE and the base station.
