How much electricity does Afghanistan use per year?

of electric energy per year. Per capita this is an average of 156 kWh. Afghanistan can partly be self-sufficient with domestically produced energy. The total production of all electric energy producing facilities is 973 m kWh. That is 15 percent of the country's own usage. The rest of the needed energy is imported from foreign countries.

What is the power supply like in Afghanistan?

Afghanistan's power supply comes from various sources, including city power produced from water dams, fuel generators, imported electricity from neighboring countries, and increasingly, solar energy. Solar energy is preferred due to its cost and sustainability.

How does electricity work in Afghanistan?

Energy in Afghanistan is provided by hydropower followed by fossil fuel and solar power. Currently, less than 50% of Afghanistan's population has access to electricity. This covers the major cities in the country.

Why does Afghanistan stop supplying electricity?

In short: It is a daunting job. Another larger, underlying problem is that the electricity-exporting countries Uzbekistan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Iran mostly sell their surplus electricity to Afghanistan. When they no longer have a surplus, they stop supplying.
