

How many coal-fired power stations are there in the Netherlands?

The Netherlands has twocoal fired power stations, at Eemshaven and Maasvlakte. They are scheduled to close by 2030. The last of the fourteen natural gas power stations were commissioned in 2013. In 2020,64.2% of the power generated in the Netherlands came from gas-fired thermal power.

Statistics Netherlands (CBS) reports this on the basis of provisional figures. A total of 120 billion kWhof electricity was produced in 2023,1 percent more than in the previous year. The amount generated from fossil fuels was 58 billion kWh,down 12 percent from the previous year.
