

How much power does a CB radio use?

The FCC allows a maximum of 4 wattsof output power for CB radios to avoid signal interference with other devices, such as TV and emergency communication radios. That varies because a manufacturer can be fined for putting out a radio with excess power, so they produce output values between 3 and 4 Watts, and in rare cases, only 2 Watts.

How much power does an antenna use?

The antenna output power level is typically between 20 watts and a few hundred wattsfor an outdoor base station. Television transmitters, by comparison, have 10-1000 times higher output power than outdoor base stations. Antennas mounted indoors use very low power levels, typically around a few watts or less.
