Uzbekistan has made a positive effort toward that end,including by setting clear targets and reforming the energy sectorand has been progressing toward achieving the solar power capacity target of 4 GW by 2026 and 5 GW by 2030.

What does Uzbekistan's government want to do?

The government of Uzbekistan also aims to develop small- and medium-scale solar projects. The President stresses the need for encouraging citizens and enterprises to develop renewable energy sources for their own demand (MoE,2021b).

Can variable solar power be used in Uzbekistan?

variable solar electricity benefits from the local flexibility provided by dispatchable, highly flexible hydropower, thus limiting impacts on the power system.
